#### **Abandoned Pesticide Advisory Board**

- <u>Mission</u>: Administer projects for the collection and disposal of abandoned pesticides.
- <u>Membership:</u> Six members consisting of one member from the Arkansas Farm Bureau, Arkansas Natural Resources Commission, UA Cooperative Extension, Division of Environmental Quality, USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service, and the Arkansas Department of Agriculture.
- <u>Terms of Service</u>: no set terms of service
  - Statutory Authority: A.C.A.8-7-1201 Abandoned Agricultural Pesticide Control Act
    - o Advise on the issuance, evaluation, and selection of requests for proposals from contractors
    - Approve payments for collection and disposal projects
    - o Identify any abandoned pesticides to be excluded from the collection and disposal program
- <u>Key Results 2015-2019</u>: Held 54 collection events and disposed of 2,662,993 pounds of unwanted pesticides.

## Arkansas Agriculture Board

- <u>Mission</u>: Advise the Arkansas Secretary of Agriculture on all matters concerning agriculture, aquaculture, horticulture, and kindred industries.
- <u>Membership</u>: 20 voting members and 8 ex officio members. Nine are appointed by various boards; 11 are appointed by the Governor with the consent of the Senate and must represent designated agricultural sectors.
- <u>Terms of Service</u>: Governor appointees are limited to two, four-year terms. Those appointed by boards or commission serve at the pleasure of their respective board or commission.
- Statutory Authority: A.C.A. 25-38-207 Arkansas Agricultural Board
  - Submit a nomination for the Arkansas Secretary of Agriculture to the Governor for confirmation
  - o Advise the Secretary on all sectors of agriculture
- <u>Key Results 2015-2019</u>:
  - o Nominated Wes Ward for Arkansas Secretary of Agriculture

## Arkansas Boll Weevil Eradication Committee

- <u>Mission</u>: Oversee the program budget and activities of the Arkansas Boll Weevil Foundation.
- <u>Membership</u>: Members of the Plant Board; no selection process established

- <u>Terms of Service</u>: None established
- <u>Statutory Authorities</u>:
  - It is a committee of the Plant Board without any statutory authority of its own.
- <u>Key Results 2015-2019</u>: The Boll Weevil Board voted to provide a rebate of \$1.00 per acre to growers from which assessments were collected in the 2018 growing season.

#### Arkansas Fire Ant Advisory Board

- <u>Mission</u>: Coordinates fire ant research efforts.
- <u>Membership</u>: Eight members as follows: Vice President for Agriculture of the University of Arkansas, the head of the Department of Entomology at the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville or his or her representative, the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture or his or her representative, and the following to be appointed from an ant-infested area by the Chair of the Arkansas Fire Ant Advisory Board:
  - o A representative of an Arkansas environmental interest group;
  - A county extension agent or a member of the general public;
  - A representative of the farm or ranch industry;
  - A representative of the horticultural or nursery industry; and
  - o A representative of the Arkansas Pest Control Association.
- <u>Terms of Service</u>: 4-year terms
- <u>Statutory Authority</u>: A.C.A. 2-16-701 Fire Ant Advisory Board
  - o meet as much as needed to discuss research opportunities
  - Key Results 2015-2019:

#### Arkansas Forestry Commission

- <u>Mission</u>: Promotion of forest resource health, conservation, and stewardship
- <u>Membership</u>: Nine members appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. Three members must be tree farmers owning 250 acres or less of timber acreage. Each congressional district must be represented.
- <u>Terms of Service</u>: Nine-year terms
- Statutory authority: A.C.A. 15-31-101 Creation, Membership, Organization, and Authorities
  - o Rulemaking
  - o Assemble and publicize information pertinent to forestry
  - Originate and conduct research in forestry matters
  - Assist private landowners and the Department of Parks and Heritage with timber management
  - Promote and furnish educational information in forestry matters to landowners, timber processors, civic organizations, schools, and other interested groups

#### Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission

- <u>Mission</u>: To control, suppress, and eradicate livestock and poultry diseases and pests; supervise livestock and poultry sanitary work in the state.
- <u>Membership</u>: Seven members who are Arkansas residents and actively engaged in the Arkansas livestock or poultry industries.
- <u>Terms of Service:</u> seven years

- <u>Membership</u>: Five members; two members actively engaged in dairy farming, one Arkansas consumer, one Arkansas milk processor, and one Arkansas retailer.
- <u>Terms of Service</u>: Five-year terms
- Statutory authority: A.C.A. 2-10-101 Arkansas Milk Stabilization Act
  - Research other states to determine how those states support their dairy farmers;
  - Investigate methods of milk production, dairy pricing, and support of the dairy industry;
  - Create and monitor a plan to assist Arkansas dairy farmers that would be equitable to all parties in the state dairy industry.

#### **Arkansas Natural Resources Commission**

- <u>Mission</u>: Manage and protect Arkansas's water and land resources for the sustainability, health, safety, and economic benefit of the State of Arkansas.

- <u>Membership</u>: Six members and six alternates appointed by the Director of the State Plant Board, with one member and alternate appointed upon the recommendation of the President of the Arkansas Seed Growers Association, President of the Arkansas Seed Dealers Association, President of the Arkansas Farm Bureau Federation, and President of the Agricultural Council of Arkansas. Ex officio members are the Director of the University of Arkansas Agricultural Experiment Station and the Director of the Arkansas Cooperative Extension Service.
- <u>Terms of Service</u>: Four-year terms
  - Statutory Authority: A.C.A.2-23-101 Arbitration of Defective Seed Claims • Hold arbitrations
- Key Results 2015-2019:
  - No arbitrations were held

## Arkansas State Board of Registration for Foresters

- <u>Mission</u>: Licenses and registers foresters who are qualified, experienced, and maintain their continuing education, for the protection of private forest landowners.
- <u>Membership</u>: Six members appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate. Five members shall be foresters engaged in forestry for at least 12 years. One member shall be a graduate of the University of Arkansas at Monticello School of Forest Resources, and one member shall be a consumer that is not actively engaged in or retired from the forestry profession. One member shall be nominated by each of the following:
  - o Arkansas Forestry Association
  - o Arkansas Forestry Commission
  - Provost of the University of Arkansas at Monticello from the School of Forest Resources' faculty or staff
  - o Arkansas Division of the Ouachita Society of American Foresters
  - o Arkansas Chapter of the Association of Consulting Foresters, Inc.
- <u>Terms of Service</u>: Five -year terms
- Statutory Authority: A.C.A.17-31-101 State Board of Registration of Foresters Act
  - o Rulemaking
  - o License and register qualified foresters
  - o Enforcement
- <u>Key Results 2015-2019</u>:
  - o Held 20 meetings
  - Issued 11 new licenses
  - o Renewed 431 licenses

#### Arkansas State Board of Registration for Professional Soil Classifiers

- <u>Mission</u>: Provides registration, regulation, and examination of soil classifiers in Arkansas.
- <u>Membership</u>: Five members appointed by the Governor subject to confirmation by the Senate and in consultation with the Arkansas Association of Professional Soil Classifiers. One member is required to be a board member of a soil conservation district, one member will be from the public at large, and three members must be registered professional soil classifiers.
- <u>Terms of Service</u>: Five-year terms
- <u>Statutory Authority:</u> A.C.A. 17-47-101 General Provisions, Arkansas Board of Registration for Professional Soil Classifiers
  - o Rulemaking
  - Finder of fact at enforcement hearings
  - o Reviews and approves endorsements and reciprocity license applications
  - o Develops and administers license examinations
  - Reviews and approves continuing education programs
- <u>Key Results 2015-2019</u>:
  - Held nine regular meetings and seven special-called meetings
  - Promulgated one rule
  - o Renewed 35 licenses

## **Commission on Water Well Construction**

- <u>Mission</u>: Licenses contractors, certifies water well drillers and pump installers, and provides oversight of technical water well construction rules for the development of underground water in an efficient, orderly, sanitary, reasonable, and safe manner.
- <u>Membership</u>: Seven members: the Secretary of the Department of Health; the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture; a person recommended by the Arkansas Heat Pump Association, the EnviroEnergy Group, or another ground water source industry association; two water well drillers located southeast of the fall line in Arkansas; and two water well drillers located southwest of the fall line.
- <u>Terms of Service</u>: Four-year terms
- <u>Statutory Authority:</u> A.C.A.17-50-101 Arkansas Water Well Construction Act;
  - o Rulemaking
  - o Enforcement actions
  - o Prepare subject matter for examinations for water well drillers and pump installers
  - Authorize the Department of Agriculture to hold certification examinations, grade examinations, and issue licenses.
- <u>Key Results 2015-2019</u>:
  - Held 30 regular meetings and one special-called meeting
  - Promulgated two rules
  - Eight enforcement actions
  - o Issued or renewed 695 licenses (not tracked separately)

## Litter Utilization Committee

- <u>Mission</u>: Facilitate utilization or removal of excess litter in nutrient surplus areas.
- <u>Membership</u>: No set number of members appointed by the Arkansas Natural Resources Commission from poultry feeding operations, Department of Agriculture staff, and other persons knowledgeable in litter management.
- <u>Terms of Service</u>: No terms established
- <u>Statutory Authority:</u> A.C.A. 15-20-1110 Litter Utilization Committee Arkansas Soil Nutrient Application and Poultry Litter Utilization Act
  - o Facilitate utilization of litter or removal of excess litter in nutrient surplus areas

- Consider methods of removal, valuation of the litter, avenues of litter distribution, and alternative uses.
- <u>Key Results 2015-2019:</u>
  - o Committee is inactive and no meetings were held

#### Private Wetland and Riparian Zone Creation, Restoration, and Conservation Committee

- <u>Mission</u>: Reviews applications for wetland and riparian zone creation and restoration tax credits, and for wetland and riparian zone conservation tax credits.
- <u>Membership</u>: Seven members as follows: Two members of the public appointed by the Arkansas Natural Resources Commission, the State Forester, and the directors of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission, the Department of Finance and Administration, the Division of Arkansas Heritage, and the Division of Environmental Quality.
- <u>Terms of Service</u>: No stated terms
- <u>Statutory Authority:</u> A.C.A.26-51-1501 Private Wetland and Riparian Zone Creation, Restoration, and Conservation Tax Credits
  - o Provides recommendations on whether proposed projects meet eligibility requirements
- <u>Key Results 2015-2019</u>:
  - Held two meetings

## **Ouachita River Commission**

- <u>Mission</u>: Study, plan, and implement needed improvements or projects, or both, to and along the main stem of the Ouachita River in Dallas, Hot Spring, Clark, Ouachita, Calhoun, Union, Bradley, and Ashley Counties.
- <u>Membership</u>: Nine members appointed by the Governor; one each from Dallas County, Hot Spring County, Clark County, Ouachita County, Calhoun County, Union County, Bradley County, and Ashley County. The ninth member is the highest-ranking official of the Ouachita River Valley Association and a resident of Arkansas.
- <u>Terms of Service</u>: Seven-year terms
- Statutory Authority: A.C.A. 15-23-801 Ouachita River Commission
  - Study, plan, and implement needed improvement and/or projects to and along the main stem of the Ouachita River in Dallas, Hot Spring, Clark, Ouachita, Calhoun, Union, Bradley, and Ashley Counties.
- <u>Key Results 2015-2019:</u> • Unavailable

## **Red River Compact Commission**

Note: The transfer of the Red River Compact Commission, rather than the Arkansas Red River Commission, to the Arkansas Department of Agriculture in the Transformation and Efficiencies Act of 2019 was a technical error. The Red River Compact Commission was established by federal law and is not a state entity. The Arkansas Red River Commission is a state entity with authority to petition local circuit courts for the establishment of improvement districts along the Red River in Arkansas.

- <u>Mission</u>: Promote interstate comity among each of the four member states (Arkansas, Oklahoma, Texas, and Louisiana) by governing use, control, and distribution of the interstate water of the Red River and its tributaries.
- <u>Membership</u>: Two representatives from each signatory state, designated/appointed in accordance with the laws of each state, and one Commissioner appointed by the President of the United States. Arkansas's representatives are the Arkansas Secretary of Agriculture and a second member residing within the basin of the Red River who is appointed by the Governor.
- <u>Terms of Service</u>: Seven-year terms
- <u>Statutory Authority:</u> PL 96-564 (1980), 94 Stat.3305
- <u>Key Results</u>:
  - o Unavailable

#### **State Plant Board**

٠	Mission: Protect and serve citizens and agricultural and business communities by providing information

- Membership: 16 voting members and two non-voting members. Membership includes:

  - A nurseryman, actively engaged in the business, to be elected by the Arkansas Green Industry Association;
  - A practical seed grower, actively engaged in the business, to be elected by the Arkansas Seed Growers Association;
  - A pest control operator, actively engaged in the business, to be elected by the Arkansas Pest Management Association, Inc.;
  - A seed dealer, actively engaged in the business, to be elected by the Arkansas Seed Dealers' Association;
  - One (1) member representing the Arkansas Bureau of Standards to be appointed by the Arkansas Oil Marketers Association;
  - A pesticide manufacturer, actively engaged in the business, to be elected by the Arkansas Crop Protection Association Inc.;
  - One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Agricultural Aviation Association, to be elected by the Arkansas Agricultural Aviation Association;
  - One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Forestry Association, to be elected by the Arkansas Forestry Association;
  - Two (2) farmers actively and principally engaged in farming in this state, appointed by the Governor;
  - One (1) representative of the livestock industry, actively engaged in the business, to be appointed by the Governor; and
  - One (1) representative of the forage industry, actively engaged in the business, to be appointed by the Governor.
- <u>Terms of Service</u>: Members appointed by the Governor serve at the pleasure of the Governor. Members appointed by an association serve at the pleasure of the association.
