RE: Advisory Opinion No. 2020-13

Dear Ms. Evans:

This letter is in response to a written request for an advisory opinion pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-715(b) which was sent to me in an email correspondence that I received on October 27, 2020, see Attachment A, regarding the application of the one-year restriction and the permanent disqualification statutory provisions to your current employment role as a result of your previous employment responsibilities with the Arkansas Department of Human Services (DHS).

This opinion is based upon the following facts that you have presented to me and upon which I am relying. It should be noted that if one or more of these facts are later shown to be incorrect, that could result in a revised opinion.

- 1. You were employed by DHS from November 2017 to September 28, 2019;
- From November 2017 to January 2019, you served as the Assistant Director for Quality Assurance for the Division of Provider Services and Quality Assurance (DPSQA);
- 3. From February 2019 to August 2019, you served as the Deputy Director for DPSQA;
- 4. From August 2019 to September 2019, you served as an Assistant Director for Quality Assurance in DPSQA;
- 5. In your role as an Assistant Director at DPSQA, for both time periods, you supervised a small management staff, which staff managed a variety of programs and services that included: Incident and Accident Reporting Unit, LTSS Background Check Unit, Nursing Assistant Training Program Unit, Nursing Home Administrator Licensure Unit, Part VI-B Individuals with Disabilities Education Act Monitoring Unit, Independent Choices Program Unit, and the Choices in Living Resource Center;
- The management staff that you directly supervised managed their own staff as well as programs, services, contracts, and grants;
- Any direct involvement that you had with these programs, services, contracts, and grants
 pertained to advising management staff on the DPSQA Director's recommendations and
 guidance;

- As a member of the division's leadership team, you followed the DPSQA Director's guidance on matters related to the interpretation and application of program and department policy;
- 9. As a DPSQA Assistant Director, you also coordinated provider engagement and outreach activities for the division including hosting several town hall provider meetings across the state. You served as a representative of the division on a number of intra-divisional projects including process mapping for home and community-based provider licensure and certification, process mapping for reporting and tracking provider complaints, electronic visit verification, and analytics dashboard development;
- 10. As the DPSQA Deputy Director, you provided professional-level support to the DPSQA Director through strategic planning, analysis, technical writing, and communication with internal and external stakeholders. You assisted the DPSQA Director with 1) assessing and monitoring division needs and priorities to reduce duplication and manual processes and to create greater automation and efficiency, 2) reviewing job functions to ensure proper cross-training and development of personnel to meet the needs of the division, and 3) routinely analyzing data and reports produced by and for the various units within the division to look for trends and opportunities for process improvement;
- 11. On September 9, 2019, you submitted a letter of resignation to DPSQA Director Jerald Sharum effective September 27, 2019 on the basis that you had accepted the position of Director of Policy and Research at eQHealth Solutions, Inc. See Attachment B;
- Pursuant to DHS Policy 1006, you disclosed the employment offer to the DHS Ethics Officer;
- 13. On September 27, 2019, DHS Chief Counsel David Sterling sent you a letter memorializing your conversations concerning your termination of employment at DHS and reminding you of the continuing obligations under state law with regard to employment of former state employees, specifically Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-709, which addresses the application of the one-year restriction and the permanent disqualification statutory provisions to a current employment role as a result of a former state employee's employment responsibilities with the state. See Attachment C;
- 14. You interpreted this letter as not applying the permanent bar restriction to you;
- You worked for eQHealth Solutions as the Director of Policy and Research from October 2019 to April 2020;
- 16. eQHealth Solutions is a population health management company with contracts in many states, including Arkansas. At the time of your employment, eQHealth Solutions performed prior authorizations for medical and therapy services for the Arkansas Medicaid population as a DHS contractor. You provided guidance and support to the executive leadership team regarding internal policies and procedures, business development, and state and federal Medicaid policy. You also served as the lead technical writer on new solicitations with various state and federal funding agencies;
- 17. In May 2020, you began working with Palco, Inc. (Palco) as the Director of Special Projects, which role 1) provides leadership in a variety of projects that span across one or more business units including business development and marketing, program management, product development, and customer service, 2) develops program policies, standard operating procedures, client outreach materials, staff training materials, and project implementation plans, 3) manages day-to-day project activities and resources, analyzes current processes for opportunities for process improvement, and serves as a

member of project management teams. Specifically, you have been responsible for policy and procedural documentation of systems currently not deployed for the Arkansas contract, been involved with Electronic Visit Verification projects in states outside of Arkansas, provided input to various bids and RFPs and RFIs for work in other states, and spent considerable time developing a case management module for another state;

- 18. Palco provides financial management services for Medicaid self-direction programs and Veterans Health Administration programs in nine states, including Arkansas. As such, Palco serves as a contractor in these nine states. In Arkansas, Palco is the recipient of two contracts overseen by the DHS DPSQA. These contracts are managed by a small team of staff that make up the Independent Choices Program Unit. The former manager of this unit reported directly to you in your capacity as an Assistant Director for DPSQA. However, during your tenure at DHS, these contracts were never procured or amended; they were renewed at the end of each contract year in both 2018 and 2019;
- 19. Palco's Financial Management Services contract (#31897) was procured through the RFP process and initially awarded in 2003. This contract has been renewed at the end of every contract year, re-procured through the competitive RFP bid process, and valued at \$1.5M annually;
- 20. Palco's Counseling contract (#31252) was procured through the RFP process and initially awarded in 2014. This contract has been renewed at the end of every contract year and is valued at \$3M annually;
- 21. Both Palco contracts were initially awarded prior to your employment with DHS;
- 22. Palco hired you for your expertise in state and federal Medicaid policy and procedures, as well as your educational background, which serves as an opportunity to provide support and assistance with complex federal programs and projects that impact both your former and current employers;
- 23. On October 20, 2020, DHS Chief Procurement Officer Mary Kathryn Williams sent you and Alicia Paladino at Palco, Inc. a letter outlining the restrictions applied to former state employees in connection with contracts and contractors with the state with specific reference to Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-709 and identifying an employer's obligations under Executive Order 98-04. Ms. Williams requested that you 1) seek an advisory opinion in regard to the application of the statutory provisions to your employment circumstances, and 2) have no involvement on Arkansas DHS contracts including, but not limited to, meetings, advice, and review. See Attachment D;
- 24. You expressly agree that Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-709(b)2) applies to you;
- 25. You maintain that you are not a principal or agent of Palco, you do not have an ownership interest in Palco, and you do not hold an executive or board position with Palco;
- 26. You assert that you have complied completely with applicable statutory provisions, you have not been involved on Palco's contracts with DHS during your one-year ban period, which period you calculate to have expired on September 28, 2020.

On November 5th, Director Jerald Sharum provided additional information on behalf of DHS, see Attachment E, concerning your request for an advisory opinion as follows:

27. Palco, Inc. has two contracts with DHS DPSQA.

- a. Contract Number 4600031897 is for the Self-Directed Financial Management Services delivery model to Medicaid recipients in a statewide plan, and was initially entered into July 1, 2014, and expires with no further additional terms June 30, 2021.
- b. Contract Number 4600031252 is for the Self-Directed Service Budget Counseling Support services for participants in a state plan or waiver program offering the selfdirected service delivery model to Medicaid recipients in a statewide plan, and was initially entered into February 10, 2014, and expires with no further additional terms February 9, 2021. (Collectively, the "Palco Contracts").
- 28. Ms. Evans' roles during her DHS employment were Assistant Director for Quality Assurance and then Deputy Director, which positions encompassed many aspects of the Palco Contracts under her official responsibilities.
- 29. One of Ms. Evans' official responsibilities was providing administrative oversight to the Independent Choices (self-direction) monitoring unit, a unit that monitors the Palco Contracts and manages ongoing daily communications with Palco, Inc. In this role, Ms. Evans directed state action through her subordinates in the monitoring unit.
- 30. Ms. Evan's *Curriculum Vitae*, see Attachment F, states that she was a founding member of the DPSQA executive team that provided administrative oversight to the Independent Choices monitoring unit.
- 31. In August 2019, Ms. Evans was the lead divisional representative of DPSQA during initial internal departmental discussions regarding the pending new procurement of these services under the Palco Contracts (due to the expiration of both contracts in 2021). During these discussions, which were conducted via email among DHS employees of various divisions, Ms. Evans analyzed the previous years of the Palco Contracts, including the services model, spending, and costs, to identify a Total Projected Cost budget for the new solicitation's seven-year lifespan. Ms. Evans also advised and communicated with the DPSQA Director and the DPSQA CFO on the best options for how the new procurement should be structured and modeled. Specifically, with the relevant services currently being contracted in two separate Palco Contacts, Ms. Evans provided recommendations to the DPSQA Director on how to combine the services into one contract with the new procurement.
- 32. Separately, in August 2019, Ms. Evans was a primary participant representing DPSQA in discussions among Palco, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), and multiple DHS divisions regarding personal care rates for individuals who receive services through those programs under the Palco Contracts where self-direction is an option (i.e.: ARChoices and Independent Choices); these discussions were conducted in response to minimum wage increases.
- 33. Ms. Evans also participated in other meetings with Palco related to the Palco Contracts and contractor activities, including communicating DHS' contractual needs to Palco, such as a CMS requirement of Explanation of Member Benefits (EOMB) in February 2019. Due to' the unique nature of self-direction, these EOMB activities could not be automatically dispersed by Medicaid, leading DHS to require Palco to select 5-6% of their member population for this purpose.
- 34. To further illustrate that Ms. Evans' official responsibilities included direct administrative authority over the Palco Contracts, Ms. Evans identified herself in her CV as "the lead contract monitor for two multi-million dollar contracts assigned to the

division." See Attachment F. These two multi-million dollar contracts were the Palco Contracts.

- 35. Ms. Evans also portrays herself in her CV as "the lead technical writer for the division for new procurements, policies, procedures and regulatory manuals." See Attachment F. As such, she assisted in developing, communicating and directing plans, policies and standards for the division on new procurements and worked closely with the DHS Office of Policy Promulgation and other division staff. Much of this work did or could have impacted the Palco Contracts, as well as the new procurements for the services currently under the Palco Contracts. One such example, also identified in her CV, is Electronic Visit Verification ("EVV"), a CMS requirement for all states, which is a multi-divisional project that directly affects the self-directed services under the Palco Contracts. The EVV project is the very service that Palco initially tried placing Ms. Evans on, leading to the discussions with DHS concerning former state employees that culminated in the Request Letter.
- 36. Finally, the Palco Contracts themselves, in the attached contract amendments and authorization forms from 2018-2019, see Attachments G, H, I, J, K, and L, identify Ms. Evans as the DHS Program Representative and a point of contact with authority for approvals. Such contract amendments are inherently a procurement function, as such is defined in Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-701 (14), in that they function to renew contracts, add funding to contracts for the buying or obtaining services, and are otherwise for the purpose of contract administration.

I. Relevant Law

In regard to former state employees and matters connected with their former duties, Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-709(b)(1) permanently disqualifies former employees from knowingly acting as a principal or as an agent for anyone other than the state in connection with any contract in which the former employee participated personally and substantially through decision, approval, disapproval, recommendation, rendering of advice, investigation, or otherwise while an employee, where the state is a party or has a direct and substantial interest. *See* Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-709(b)(1).

Another ethical restriction addresses a one-year representation restriction regarding matters for which a former employee was officially responsible. Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-709(b)(2) provides that it is a breach of ethical standards for any former state employee, within one year after cessation of the former employee's official responsibility in connection with any contract to knowingly act as a principal or as an agent for anyone other than the state in matters which were within the former employee's official responsibility, where the state is a party or has a direct or substantial interest. *Id.* The latter restriction only applies for one year after cessation of the former employee's official responsibility in connection with any contract at issue. *Id.*

For purposes of interpreting Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-701 *et seq.*, section 19-11-701 (8) defines "employee" as "an individual drawing a salary from a state agency, whether elected or not, and any nonsalaried individual performing personal services for any state agency." "State agency" is defined in section 19-11-701 (16) as meaning "any office, department, commission, council,

board, bureau, committee, institution, legislative body, agency, government corporation, or other establishment or official of the executive, judicial, or legislative branch of this state."

The public policy underlying section 19-11-701 *et seq.* is to "... promote and balance the objective of protecting government integrity and the objective of facilitating the recruitment and retention of personnel needed by the state." *See* Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-703(a). "The policy is implemented by prescribing essential restrictions against conflict of interest without creating unnecessary obstacles to entering public service." *Id.* The intent is to require state employees to "discharge their duties impartially so as to assure fair competitive access to governmental procurement by responsible contractors ...," and to "... conduct themselves in such a manner as to foster public confidence in the integrity of the state procurement organization." *See* Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-703 (b). These statutes are a codification of, and can be understood against, the common law which forbade public officials from engaging in self-dealing in regard to contracts. *See Price v. Edmonds*, 232 Ark. 381, 337 S.W.2d 658 (1960). Taken together, then, these provisions make clear that the restrictions should not be construed in an overly broad manner that reaches beyond true conflicts of interest, but should be balanced against the legislative intent to avoid unnecessary restrictions and construed pragmatically and with common sense so as to prevent actual conflicts of interest and self-dealing.

Arkansas Code Ann. § 19-11-715(b) gives the Secretary of the Department of Finance and Administration (DF&A) authority to, upon written request of an employee or contractor and in consultation with the Attorney General, render an advisory opinion regarding the appropriateness of the course of conduct to be followed in proposed transactions.

II. Analysis

As a threshold matter, I reiterate that I am relying upon the representations that you have presented to me and those that have been relayed to me by Director Sharum. As noted above, section 19-11-715(b) gives me authority, as the Secretary of DF&A, to issue an advisory opinion, upon written request of employees or contractors and in consultation with the Attorney General, regarding the appropriateness of the course of conduct to be followed. It does not, however, confer upon me the authority to subpoena documents, compel sworn statements, or utilize other investigative tools entrusted to judicial officers and law enforcement. Consequently, the employee or former employee, contractor and contracting agency are in superior positions to ascertain the relevant facts and, beyond doing basic due diligence in researching publicly available information, I rely upon the information provided to me in analyzing and formulating my opinions. This opinion is limited to the representations submitted to me and is withdrawn in the event that any of the material information presented to me proves to be false.

Based on the submitted information as applied to the above-cited statutory provisions, your former employment with DHS certainly classifies you as a former state employee and, given that you ended your employment with DHS on September 28, 2019, the one year statutory "cooling off" period has expired.

The salient question before me then is whether you, as a former state employee, would be knowingly acting as a principal or as an agent for Palco in connection with any Palco contract in

which you participated personally and substantially through decision, approval, disapproval, recommendation, rendering of advice, investigation, or otherwise while an employee, where the state is a party or has a direct and substantial interest; if so, then the statutory permanent disqualification applies to you.

In reviewing the information that you have provided, as well as the information provided by Director Sharum, I note that both recitations reflect that the DHS manager of the monitoring unit of the Palco contracts reported directly to you in your capacity as an Assistant Director for DPSQA. However, there is a significant omission of details in your outline of relevant DHS management roles compared to the specific facts characterizing your involvement in the Palco contracts provided by Director Sharum. Without belaboring the issue, the comparison between the points of view is clearly provided in the 36 paragraphs of factual representations listed above.

An illustrative example of the contrast in viewpoints is your statement that, as Assistant Director at DPSQA, "you supervised a small management staff," "[t]he management staff that you directly supervised managed their own staff as well as programs, services, contracts, and grants," and "[a]ny direct involvement that you had with these programs, services, contracts, and grants pertained to advising management staff on the DPSQA Director's recommendations and guidance," see Paragraph Nos. 5, 6, and 7, and Director Sharum's statement that "the Palco Contracts themselves, in the attached contract amendments and authorization forms from 2018-2019, identify Ms. Evans as the DHS Program Representative and a point of contact with authority for approvals. Such contract amendments are inherently a procurement function, as such is defined in Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-701 (14), in that they function to renew contracts, add funding to contracts for the buying or obtaining services, and are otherwise for the purpose of contract administration." See Paragraph No. 36 and Attachments G, H, I, J, K, and L.

In addition, your own curriculum vitae expressly states that, in your role as Deputy Director of DPSQA, you "serve[d] as the lead contract monitor for two multi-million dollar contracts assigned to the division", and "serve[d] as the lead technical writer for the division for new procurements, policies, procedures, and regulatory manuals." See Attachment F. These representations refer to the DHS contract documents relating to Palco, noted above, that collectively identify you as the agency representative submitting/tracking the contract, the program representative, and as a point of contact on behalf of both of the Palco contracts. See Attachments G, H, I, J, K, and L. Furthermore, despite your assertion that during your tenure at DHS the Palco contracts were never procured or amended, Attachments K and L clearly demonstrate that Contract No. 4600031897 was amended twice during your DHS employment, and you were identified as the agency representative submitting/tracking the contract.

Based on the submitted documentation, I am persuaded that DHS's characterization of your management roles and responsibilities for the Palco contracts, in which the state is a party, is clearly apparent and that your participation in those contracts was both personal and substantial. Although Palco proposes to assign these state contracts to you, the statutorily mandated permanent disqualification applies to you and prohibits Palco from doing so lawfully.

III. Decision

Thank you for seeking my counsel. I am persuaded that, under the representations as stated above, the statutory permanent disqualification applies to you in the current circumstances pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-709(b)(1). Compliance with the above course of conduct is deemed to constitute compliance with the ethical standards of Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-701 et seq. and Executive Order 98-04.

Secretary Walther,

I am requesting an advisory opinion pursuant to A.C.A § 19-11-715(b) on behalf of myself, Victoria Evans.

On October 20, 2020, I received a letter from Mary Kathryn Williams, advising me to seek an advisory opinion as to whether I can perform work for Palco at the current time. The letter states that "at minimum, the one-year restriction should have applied" to my employment and that "it is entirely possible that the permanent disqualification should also apply." Until this matter is resolved, I have been requested to have "no involvement on Arkansas DHS contracts" until an opinion is issued. As such, I am requesting an advisory opinion be issued as soon as possible.

I was employed by the Arkansas Department of Human Services for nearly two years, from November 2017 to September 28, 2019. In my last official capacity at DHS, I served as an Assistant Director for Quality Assurance in the Division of Provider Services and Quality Assurance (DPSQA) from August 2019 to September 2019. Prior to that, I served as the Deputy Director for DPSQA from February 2019 to August 2019 and as the Assistant Director for Quality Assurance from November 2017 to January 2019.

During my time as a DPSQA Assistant Director (8/2019-9/2019, 11/2017-1/2019), I supervised a small management staff. This staff managed a variety of programs and services and included the following units: Incident and Accident Reporting unit, the LTSS Background Check unit, the Nursing Assistant Training Program unit, the Nursing Home Administrator Licensure unit, the Part VI-B Individuals with Disabilities Education Act Monitoring unit, the Independent Choices program unit, and the Choices in Living Resource Center. The management staff that I directly supervised, managed their own staff as well programs, services, contracts, and grants. Any direct involvement I had with these programs, services, contracts, and/or grants pertained to advising management staff on the DPSQA Director's recommendations and guidance. As a member of the division's leadership team, I followed the DPSQA Director's guidance on matters related to the interpretation and application of program and department policy.

As a DPSQA Assistant Director (8/2019-9/2019, 11/2017-1/2019), I also coordinated provider engagement and outreach activities for the division including hosting several town hall provider meetings across the state. I served as a representative of the division on a number of intradivisional projects including process mapping for home- and community-based provider licensure and certification, process mapping for reporting and tracking provider complaints, electronic visit verification, and analytics dashboard development. During my tenure as the DPSQA Deputy Director (2/2019-8/2019), I provided professional-level support to the DPSQA Director through strategic planning, analysis, technical writing, and communication with internal and external stakeholders. I assisted the DPSQA Director with assessing and monitoring division needs and priorities to reduce duplication and manual processes and create greater automation and efficiency. I assisted the DPSQA Director in reviewing job functions to ensure proper cross-training and development of personnel to meet



the needs of the division. I also routinely analyzed data and reports produced by and for the various units within the division to look for trends and opportunities for process improvement.

My last date of employment with DHS was September 28, 2019. On September 27, 2019, I received a letter that cited Arkansas Code Annotated §19-11-709(b)(2), which, in short states that as a former DHS employee, I was unable to work on matters pertaining to DHS for one (1) year (see attached letter re: Employment Transition to Private Sector). This letter did not mention that a permanent bar may exist. It was my interpretation of this letter that the permanent bar, cited in the letter dated October 20, 2020 and also found at A.C.A. §19-11-709(b)(1), does not apply to me. As the facts below iterate, I've taken every measure to successfully comply with A.C.A. §19-11-709, as requested of me.

After leaving DHS on September 28, 2019, I worked for eQHealth Solutions as the Director of Policy and Research from October 2019 to April 2020. eQHealth Solutions is a population health management company with contracts in many states, including Arkansas. At the time of my employment, eQHealth Solutions performed prior authorizations for medical and therapy services for the Arkansas Medicaid population as a contractor for DHS. This offer of employment was disclosed to the DHS Ethics Officer prior to my departure from DHS per DHS Policy 1006. As the Director of Policy and Research at eQHealth Solutions, I provided guidance and support to the executive leadership team regarding internal policies and procedures, business development, and state and federal Medicaid policy. I also served as the lead technical writer on new solicitations with various state and federal funding agencies.

I began working with Palco, Inc. in May 2020 as the Director of Special Projects. In this role, I provide leadership in a variety of projects that span across one or more business units including business development and marketing, program management, product development, and customer service. I work to develop program policies, standard operating procedures, client outreach materials, staff training materials, and project implementation plans. I manage day-to-day project activities and resources, analyze current processes for opportunities for process improvement, and serve as a member of project management teams. Specifically, I have been responsible for policy and procedural documentation of systems currently not deployed for their Arkansas contract, involved with Electronic Visit Verification (EVV) projects in states outside of Arkansas, provided input to various bids and RFPs/RFIs for work in other states, and spent considerable time developing a case management module for another state.

Palco, Inc. provides financial management services for Medicaid self-direction programs and Veterans Health Administration programs in nine states, including Arkansas. As such, Palco serves as a contractor in these nine states. In Arkansas, Palco is the recipient of two contracts overseen by the DHS Division of Provider Services and Quality Assurance. These contracts are managed by a small team of staff that make up the IndependentChoices program unit. The former manager of this unit reported directly to me in my capacity as an Assistant Director for DPSQA. However, during my tenure at DHS these contracts were never procured or amended; they were simply renewed at the end of each contract year in both 2018 and 2019.

Both contracts held by Palco, Inc. were procured as RFPs. The Financial Management Services contract (#31897) was initially awarded to Palco, Inc. in 2003. This contract has been renewed at the end of every contract year and re-procured through the competitive RFP bid process. Palco has served as the Financial Management Services vendor for the state of Arkansas since 2003. This contract is valued at \$1.5 million annually. The Counseling contract (#31252) was initially awarded to Palco, Inc. in 2014 through the competitive RFP bid process. It has been

renewed at the end of every contract year and is valued at \$3 million annually. Both of these contracts were initially awarded prior to my employment with DHS.

Palco hired me for my expertise in state and federal Medicaid policy and procedures, as well as my educational background – both of which serve as an opportunity to provide support and assistance with complex federal programs and projects that impact both my former and current employer.

As previously mentioned, the October 20, 2020 letter cites that a permanent bar of employment may apply to me. I respectfully disagree. A.C.A. §19-11-709(b)(1) states that permanent bars apply to any former DHS employer who "knowingly act[s] as a *principal* or as an *agent* for anyone other than the state in connection with any:

- (A) Judicial or other proceeding, application, request for a ruling, or other determination;
- (B) Contract;
- (C) Claim; or
- (D) Charge or controversy, knowingly to act as a principal or as an agent for anyone other than the state in matters which were within the former employee's official responsibility, where the state is a party or has a direct or substantial interest."

Currently, Palco is only engaged in a contract, and I am not a principal or agent of Palco's. I do not have ownership interest in the company, nor do I hold executive or Board positions.

A.C.A. §19-11-709(b)(2) provides similar language, except it applies to "any former employee" and not principals or agents and applies only a one-year bar. The October 20, 2020 letter took the position that this section applies to me, and I agree.

I have complied completely with this law. I have not been involved on Palco's contracts with DHS during my one-year ban period, which expired on September 28, 2020. Now that my one-year cooling period has lapsed, I respectfully request an immediate advisory opinion pursuant to A.C.A § 19-11-715(b) so that we can promptly put this matter behind us and move forward. Please advise as to the appropriate course of conduct going forward, following my one-year cooling off period which ended September 28, 2020.

This memorializes our conversation with regard to your planned departure from employment with the Arkansas Department of Human Services (DHS) as Assistant Director of the Division of Provider Services and Quality Assurance (DPSQA) to work in the private sector. You provided your official notice in writing to your supervisor, Jerald Sharum, and will be going to work with EQHealth.

I understand you conferred with the DHS Ethics Officer in compliance with DHS Policy 1006, and the facts presented in this matter do not indicate any conflicts of interest or appearances of impropriety. This letter is just a friendly reminder to make you aware of the continuing obligations under state law with regard to employment of former state employees.

Arkansas Code Ann. § 19-11-709 provides in pertinent part that it is:

a breach of ethical standards for any former employee, within one (1) year after cessation of the former employee's official responsibility in connection with any:

- (A) Judicial or other proceeding, application, request for a ruling, or other determination;
- (B) Contract;
- (C) Claim; or
- (D) Charge or controversy,

knowingly to act as a principal or as an agent for anyone other than the state in matters which were within the former employee's official responsibility, where the state is a party or has a direct or substantial interest.

Re: Restrictions on employment of former state employees

A.C.A. § 19-11-709


Ms. Paladino and Ms. Evans:

Arkansas Code Annotated § 19-11-709 (b)(1)(2) outlines the restrictions applied to former state employees in connection with contracts and contractors with the state. A.C.A. § 19-11-709 (b)(1) describes the factors leading to permanent disqualification of former state employees, while A.C.A. § 19-11-709 (b)(2) describes the factors for a one-year restriction for former state employees. As DHS ultimately is not the state agency tasked with interpreting these statutes, at this time, I will not apply analysis to Ms. Evans' scenario other than to say at the minimum, the one-year restriction should have applied. It is entirely possible the permanent disqualification should also apply, but an advisory opinion should be sought to determine this.

Accordingly, DHS requests that Ms. Evans seek said advisory opinion pursuant to A.C.A. § 19-11-715(b) to determine the appropriate course of conduct going forward. To do so, Ms. Evans should send a request letter to Larry Walther, Secretary of the Department of Finance and Administration, stating that she is requesting an advisory opinion pursuant to A.C.A. § 19-11-715(b) and explaining thoroughly her former job scope with DHS, her job scope now for PALCO, and why or how, in light of A.C.A. § 19-11-709, she believes it is appropriate to proceed. Alternatively, PALCO may seek the advisory opinion pursuant to A.C.A. § 19-11-715(b) with its request also containing the job scope information pertaining to Ms. Evans and PALCO's position on why it is appropriate to proceed.

I suggest mailing the signed original letter to Secretary Walther's office, sending electronic copies via email to Secretary Walther (larry.walther@dfa.arkansas.gov), and copying OSP Counsel Anthony Black (Anthony.Black@dfa.arkansas.gov) into the email. Doing so will cut

down on the time it takes for the letter to be routed for drafting. The process would be the same should PALCO elect to issue the request rather than Ms. Evans. Also, keep me advised as you submit information, as DHS will also submit evidence regarding the advisory opinion.

As the letter is being written, it might be helpful to review the relevant statutes, which may be found at https://www.dfa.arkansas.gov/images/uploads/procurementOffice/lawsRegs.pdf.

In addition to the statutes cited above, Executive Order 98-04 mandates that PALCO must disclose Ms. Evans' employment on any Contract and Grant Disclosure Form that PALCO is required to complete, which occurs at the execution, renewal, or amendment of contracts. If, at the time of disclosure, the matter has not been resolved via advisory opinion, the contract will be jeopardized.

Finally, I would note that, until this matter has been resolved, DHS requests that Ms. Evans have no involvement on Arkansas DHS contracts including but not limited to meetings, advice, and review. Compliance with applicable statutes and regulations are contained in the performance indicators within the contract, and DHS will be mindful of those as we proceed.

The Department of Human Services ("DHS") was made aware of a request for an advisory opinion sent to you by Victoria Evans, on or about October 26, 2020, seeking an advisory opinion pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-715(b), regarding Ms. Evans' former state employment with DHS and present employment with DHS contractor Palco, Inc. (the "Request Letter") in light of the ethical standards under Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-701 et seq. DHS is submitting this letter and attached documents for your consideration in reviewing this matter.

The public policy undergirding Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-701 et seq is to "promote and balance the objective of protecting government integrity and the objective of facilitating the recruitment and retention of personnel needed by the state." Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-703 (a). "The policy is implemented by prescribing essential restrictions against conflict of interest without creating unnecessary obstacles to entering public service." Id. The intent is to require state employees to "discharge their duties impartially so as to assure fair competitive access to governmental procurement by responsible contractors." and to "conduct themselves in such a manner as to foster public confidence in the integrity of the state procurement organization." Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-703 (b). It is with these stated goals in mind that DHS expresses concern with Ms. Evans' involvement in the relevant Palco, Inc. contracts with DHS, and thus seeks to ensure that you have the information required to make a determination.

I. Relevant Law

Regarding former state employees in matters connected with their former duties, Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-709 (b)(1) permanently disqualifies former employees of state agencies from knowingly acting as a principal or as an agent for anyone other than the state in connection with any contract in which the former employee participated personally and substantially through decision, approval, disapproval, recommendation, rendering of advice, investigation, or otherwise while an employee, where the state is a party or has a direct and substantial interest. See Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-709 (b)(1).

Another ethical restriction on the involvement of former state employees regarding matters for which a former employee was officially responsible resides at Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-709 (b)(2), which provides that it is a breach of ethical standards for any former state employee knowingly to act as a principal or as an agent for anyone other than the state in matters which were within the former employee's official responsibility, where the state is a party or has a direct or substantial interest. See id. The latter restriction only applies for one year after cessation of the former employee's official responsibility in connection with any contract at issue. Id.

For purposes of interpreting Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-701 et seq., Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-701 (8) defines "employee," as an individual drawing a salary from a state agency, whether elected or not, and any nonsalaried individual performing personal services for any state agency. "Official responsibility," is defined in Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-701 (12) as direct administrative or operating authority, whether immediate or final, either exercisable alone or with others, either personally or through subordinates, to approve, disapprove, or otherwise direct state action. Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-701 (14) defines "procurement" as "buying, purchasing, renting, leasing, or otherwise obtaining of any commodities or services" before additionally including "functions that pertain to the obtaining of any public procurement, including description of requirements, selection and solicitation of sources, preparation and award of contract, and all phases of contract administration. Finally, "state agency" in Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-701 (16) means any office, department, commission, council, board, bureau, committee, institution, legislative body, agency, government corporation, or other establishment or official of the executive, judicial, or legislative branch of this state.

II. Relevant Facts

Palco, Inc. has two contracts with DHS Division of Provider Services and Quality Assurance ("DPSQA"). Contract Number 4600031897 is for the Self-Directed Financial Management Services delivery model to Medicaid recipients in a statewide plan, and was initially entered into July 1, 2014, and expires with no further additional terms June 30, 2021. Contract Number 46000161008 is for the Self-Directed Service Budget Counseling Support services for participants in a state plan or waiver program offering the self directed service delivery model to Medicaid recipients in a statewide plan, and was initially entered into February 10, 2014, and expires with no further additional terms February 9, 2021. (Collectively, the "Palco Contracts").

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Ms. Evans was a DHS/DPSQA employee until September 28, 2019¹. Her DHS employment and titles during this time, Assistant Director for Quality Assurance and then Deputy Director, brought many aspects of the Palco Contracts under her official responsibilities.

One of Ms. Evans' official responsibilities was providing administrative oversight to the Independent Choices (self-direction) monitoring unit, a unit that monitors the Palco Contracts and manages ongoing daily communications with Palco, Inc. In this role, Ms. Evans directed state action through her subordinates in the monitoring unit. Indeed, Ms. Evan's Curriculum Vitae², attached hereto (the "CV"), states that she was a founding member of the DPSQA executive team that provided administrative oversight to the Independent Choices monitoring unit.

Also, in August 2019, Ms. Evans was the lead divisional representative of DPSQA during initial internal departmental discussions regarding the pending new procurement of these services under the Palco Contracts (due to the expiration of both contracts in 2021). During these discussions, conducted via email between DHS employees of various divisions, Ms. Evans analyzed the previous years of the Palco Contracts, including the services model, spending and costs, to identify a Total Projected Cost budget for the new solicitation's seven-year lifespan. Ms. Evans also advised and communicated with the DPSQA Director and the DPSQA CFO on the best options for how the new procurement should be structured and modeled. Specifically, with the relevant services currently being contracted in the two separate Palco Contacts, Ms. Evans provided recommendations to the DPSQA Director on how to combine the services into one contract with the new procurement.

Separately, in August 2019, Ms. Evans was a primary participant representing DPSQA in discussions between Palco Inc., the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services ("CMS"), and multiple DHS divisions regarding personal care rates for individuals who receive services through those programs under the Palco Contracts where self-direction is an option (ie: ARChoices and Independent Choices), discussions conducted in response to minimum wage increases.

Ms. Evans also participated in other meetings with Palco Inc. related to the Palco Contracts and contractor activities, including communicating DHS' contractual needs to Palco Inc., such as a CMS requirement of Explanation of Member Benefits ("EOMB") in February 2019. Due to the unique nature of self-direction, these EOMB activities could not be automatically dispersed by Medicaid, leading DHS to require Palco Inc. to select 5-6% of their member population for this purpose.

To further illustrate that Ms. Evans' official responsibilities included direct administrative authority over the Palco Contracts, Ms. Evans identified herself in the CV as "the lead contract monitor for two multi-million dollar contracts assigned to the division." These two multi-million dollar contracts were the Palco Contracts. Ms. Evans also identifies herself as "the lead technical

writer for the division for new procurements, policies, procedures and regulatory manuals." As such, she assisted in developing, communicating and directing plans, policies and standards for the division, as well as working closely with the DHS Office of Policy Promulgation and other division staff, including on new procurements. Much of this work did or could have impacted the Palco Contracts, as well as the new procurements for the services currently under the Palco Contracts. One such example, also identified in her CV, is Electronic Visit Verification ("EVV"), a CMS requirement for all states, which is a multi-divisional project that directly affects the self-directed services under the Palco Contracts. The EVV project is the very service that Palco initially tried placing Ms. Evans on, leading to the discussions with DHS concerning former state employees that culminated in the Request Letter.

Finally, the Paleo Contracts themselves, in the attached contract amendments and authorization forms from 2018-2019, identify Ms. Evans as the DHS Program Representative and a point of contact with authority for approvals. Such contract amendments are inherently a procurement function, as such is defined in Ark. Code Ann. §19-11-701 (14), in that they function to renew contracts, add funding to contracts for the buying or obtaining services, and are otherwise for the purpose of contract administration.

III. Conclusion

As alluded to above, DHS takes seriously the intent of the above cited statutes to "foster public confidence in the integrity of the state procurement organization." For this reason, DHS furnishes this letter and attachments, and expresses its concern with Ms. Evans' involvement, on behalf of the contractor as a principal or as an agent, with the Paleo Contracts or with future contracts for the services that were under Ms. Evans' official responsibilities with DHS.
